DEPARTMENT OF OBSCURE AND OFTEN WORTHLESS INFORMATION

Entry of the United States into World War I in 1917 gave the Society of Automotive Engineers its big opportunity to prove its worth. One of the first jobs it tackled for the War Department was to design a three-ton truck having a five-ton capacity. Starting in May 1917, conferences were held to standardize different components to meet this end. Then the War Department decided that it was not practical to adapt existing models to the specifications, and asked for a complete new vehicle standardized from front bumper to tail light. By August 1 the society was ready to begin the work. By

September 10 the blueprints were 90 percent finished, and the chassis was designed a few days later. By October 1 the details of the design were completed, and a week later-a sample truck was built -- 69 days between the calling together of the engineers and the completion of the first sample.
